Once school begins again in the fall, we believe this shift will enable us to get ahead financially (and build our emergency fund back up), while Frank continues his studies.


The final weekend of May saw us hosting a movie night with some married friends, here at Moody, as well as visiting the **Chicago Tabernacle**, located north of Downtown.
